## Check List Before We Leave on July 11...

- ❑ Turn in your \$69 deposit to Benjamin by Sunday, March 21.
- ❑ Participate in FLY Fundraisers and/or raise funding on your own through sponsorships from friends and family members.
- ❑ Attend FLY on Sunday Nights on a regular basis so you don't miss any announcements related to the trip.
- ❑ Prior to going on the trip you must have an up-to-date tetanus shot (within the past 10 years.)
- ❑ Everyone (youth and adults) must have a notarized permission slip and release of liability to attend.
- ❑ Attend the final info session on Sunday, June 27 at 5:30pm (notary will be present to do forms for free)
- ❑ Prepare to dress according to TEAMeffort's Dress Code:  
*They ask that "closed toed shoes, t-shirts and **modest** shorts or pants be worn to the worksite and to other activities." They also ask that "only one piece bathing suits are worn."*

## How Do I Sign Up?

A sign-up sheet is located on the FLY bulletin board outside the church offices. A **\$69 non-refundable deposit** is required to secure your spot on this year's mission trip. Your deposit is **due to the church by Sunday, March 21, 2009.** *(Checks Payable to Rehobeth UMC)*

## Is \$69 All I Will Owe?

The total cost per-person for the Mission Trip is \$269 per-person. The remaining \$200 (after deposit of \$69 is paid) can be "worked off" by participating in fundraisers organized by Faith Leading Youth and other groups within Rehobeth UMC.

## How Do I Raise Money?

FLY will be conducting several group fundraisers for this Mission Trip. Funds raised at each group fundraiser will be divided evenly among the participants who help at the fundraiser. It is very important that everyone participate in each fundraiser! (You are also welcome to collect donations from friends, family members, etc.)

## Who's Leading The Trip?

This year we are teaming up with Oak Grove United Methodist Church Youth from Mocksville, NC for our Mission Trip.

Benjamin and his girlfriend, Ryanne, will be co-leading the trip along with other Safe Sanctuary Background Check approved adults from each church. The two churches will travel in separate vehicles to Gatlinburg, but will be housed together and work together on the projects assigned by the site leaders of TEAMeffort located in Gatlinburg.

## Who Can Go On The Trip?

All youth in grades 6 and up (during the 2009-10 school year) are welcome to go on this trip. The trip is open to friends of FLY members, but they will be responsible for fundraising just like all Rehobeth UMC FLY members.

## What Will We Be Doing?

All of our work will be organized by our coordinating group, TEAMeffort. They will supply us with all tools and materials required for the projects we will be working on. Projects will include painting and home repair along with work at a local ministry for the deaf and with the families they serve.

## Where Will We Stay?

We will stay in college dorms with use of Chapel, pool, dining and recreation facilities.
